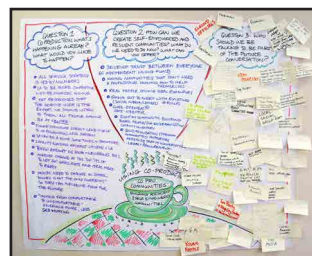
1. Purpose of the meet-up?

To continue to grow co-production in North Wales, our 1 day training event will provide participants with the opportunity to:

- Learn more about Co-Production and what it is.
- Learn how to start Co-Production and ways it can be used.
- Hear 'real life' case studies/stories, and how people overcame barriers.
- Take part in 'big conversations' to 'think differently' and find solutions.
- Connect with other people from North Wales and build relationships.
- Think about the connection between Co-Production and compassionate communities.

2. What's the agenda?

Over 40 attended the first event, and we've had very positive feedback and requests for more events, training and resources. People requested a longer event, with sections for different levels of expertise, some requested 'how to start' with others wanting a more specialised focus. Taking on board this feedback we will be delivering the event in 2 sessions, using participant-centred, visual-led methods:

10.00am Arrival, refreshments, networking

10.30am Session 1: Co-Production: What is it, how it can be used, starting Co-Production. Speakers and interactive sessions.

12.45pm Lunch

1.30pm Session 2: Co-Production and older people, Using Co-Production to improve older people's lives.

3.15pm Session 2 ends, refreshments and networking.

3.45pm Event finishes.

3. Who should attend?

Anyone interested in learning more about or using Co-Production; in particular anyone in the 6 counties across North Wales, but all are welcome!

4. Cost?

This is a training event, and we will issue CPD certificates. The suggested ticket costs cover the venue and refreshments, materials and time to collate and share the event outcomes. To make it as inclusive as possible we are suggesting a price, so those that can pay will subsidise those that are not able to. It is more important that people attend, we do not want the ticket price to be a barrier, you can pay more or less than our suggestion.
